

Achieve a county population of 66,101 for a year-over-year increase of .05% for 5 years.


Strategy

4. Continuing to incorporate arts and culture into every day lives our residents.


Demographics – Population Trend

Goals



Forward Wayne County's strategy for improving the Poverty Level and Per Capita Personal Income is to:


1. Supporting better employment options and wages for residents.


ALICE in Wayne County



ALICE is an acronym for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed. They constitute households that earn more than the Federal Poverty Level, but less than the basic cost of living for the county (the ALICE Threshold).





2. Supporting training and education that will lead to promotions and increase in wages.


Per Capita Personal Income

Median Household Income in Wayne County is 16.9% less than the rest of the state and 30.3% less than the United States average.




Distribution by Industry in Wayne County

Job Market – Occupation Distribution


by Industry in Wayne County and Indiana

Goal


Increase to 35% of the population, ages 25-64, holding an associate degree or higher by 2025.

Strategy


We will work to increase our county’s credential attainment, by:

Goal


Increase Grossed Assessed Value annually at a rate at or above the state average

Strategy


Our efforts to increasing assessed value include:

Housing – Value




Housing – Median Home Value




